On the anniversary of Billy Graham's death, I wanted to reflect on his legacy. I grew up driving on the Billy Graham

Parkway, lived for two years in the same mountain town where he lived for much of his life. But what is his legacy and how can we learn from him?

First, Billy worked with different Christian denominations. Prior to his work, many revival leaders refused to work with local churches that belonged to different denominations. Wherever Jesus was glorified Graham was willing to work with you.

Second, Graham has a high degree of personal integrity. Early in his ministry he established that he would not meet privately with members of the opposite sex. Although this decision is not always popular today, it protected his marriage for more than forty years.

Third, Billy was able to be-friend people regardless of their political position. He became America's pastor by meeting with Presidents of both parties. How many of us today would give up our political opinions to pray, minister, and read the word to people with different views than we have? Not many.

In celebration of his legacy, we should strive to become more like him. Graham certainly embodied the compassion, witness, and Gospel of Christ. Let's follow his example, Christ's example, and ask for compassion for those in our sphere of influence.




Wednesdays at 7pm: Study of Proverbs continues this month.

## Stories of Faith

During the past several months, I have had the opportunity to speak with many people who

have been affected in some way by the COVID pandemic. Our churches and communities have also been affected. Mt. Olive isn't immune, and our church attendance has dropped off significantly since the pandemic began. I have been both inspired AND depressed by our reaction to the crisis. There are many who have helped others and worked non-stop during this pandemic...true heroes. There are some who have not and still do not feel comfortable being around other people because of age or health, which is entirely understandable. The COVID pandemic is real. There are others who won't come to church because they don't want to wear a mask, and they feel it is their right not to wear one. There are others still who have allowed complacency and apathy to creep into their lives, and it is so much easier to stay at home on Sunday and Wednesday, even though they will go out and do other things during the week.
