

## STORIES OF FAITH IN ACTION

"Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness."

James 1:3

#### **Forward Facing Faith**

I recently saw a quote from Sam Elliot. The quote reminded me that we no longer have control over what has happened in the past. We only can affect the present and future. Sam said that there is a reason that the rear-view mirror in a vehicle is so small, and the windshield is much larger. He said where you are heading is more important than where you have been. I have thought about that for several days and realize that there is a lot of truth to those statements. I don't know about you, but I want the rest of my life to be lived for God. I can only imagine the amount of time I have wasted worrying about things that don't really matter in my Christian life. Let's look at a couple of people who realized much of their life was wasted but spent the last several years doing God's work.

Saul was a persecutor of Christians. He thought he was doing the right thing, even believing that God put him in his place. Saul was zealous and believed the new Christians were enemies of God. However, Saul met the Master on the road to Damascus, and his life was changed forever. His name was even changed to Paul. Paul went on multiple missionary journeys and preached to masses of people. He wrote many of the letters of the New Testament. All the energy that Saul used to persecute Christians was redirected to living for Christ. Paul could never undo what he had done to others, but the rest of his life was used to direct others on how to live for Christ. Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 5:17, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come."

C.S. Lewis is known worldwide for being the most influential Christian apologist of his time, and for the many books he authored. Mere Christianity was voted best book of the 20<sup>th</sup> century by Christianity Today. The Chronicles of Narnia had very strong Christian themes aimed at young readers. Many people may not know that Lewis was once an atheist, viewing his religious upbringing as a chore and a duty. He had a strong interest in the occult and argued against God. As a matter of fact, Lewis says that he was brought into Christianity like a prodigal, looking for a reason to escape. In 1931, after years of resisting God's influence in his life, he admitted God was who he said he was, knelt, and prayed for forgiveness. For the entirety of his life, C.S. Lewis served God...even visiting RAF stations to speak on his faith during WW2.

I like to remember that Jesus had a forward-facing faith. Of course, he was God and could see beyond the present. Jesus endured the suffering and pain for everyone who was willing to turn to him. As Christians, we should endure and continue running the race that is set before us as Hebrews 12 states. Love Christ and look forward to what he has in store for all of us...eternal life!
