

Happy New Year, Kings and Queens. Our identity as a son or daughter of God is what propels us over the hump of victory over sin in our lives, according to Romans 8. It says, "So then, brothers, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. For if you live according to the flesh you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God." The goal is to be lead by the spirit; this is #1. Peak spiritual connection with God comes not when we try the hardest but when we let go. Verse 15: "For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!"
