Faith--- Groundhog Day for Christians?

On February 2nd of every year, Groundhog Day is commemorated in a small town in Pennsylvania. This observance has been occurring in the town of Punxsutawney since 1887. People congregate to the Gobbler Knob part of town to consult the groundhog. Tradition states that if the groundhog sees his shadow when he emerges from his burrow (a "cage" nowadays), he will retreat, and winter will continue for six more weeks. If the groundhog does not see his shadow, spring will come early. If I am being honest, I'm a big fan of cloudy skies on February 2nd. The movie with Bill Murray is what a lot of people remember about Groundhog Day. In the movie, Bill Murray's character (Phil) wakes up every morning and is stuck in the same day OVER and OVER. Phil was frustrated because he had been sent to cover the story four years in a row. Phil initially uses this to his advantage but feels that he is doomed to spend the rest of his life seeing the same people and doing the same things over and over. Phil wasn't only making himself miserable; he was making everyone else miserable as well. Phil eventually stops hurting himself and others and uses his knowledge to change himself and others' lives in a positive way.

I think we all look at our lives and see times when we wish we could re-do some things. I think often of my mother and how I wish I would have spent even more time with her. I wish I would have made the decision to follow Christ's teaching at a younger age and been more in tune with what he was doing around me. I am reminded of Solomon's attempt to find his sense of happiness in Ecclesiastes 2:11, "Then I considered all that my hands had done and the toil I had expended in doing it, and behold, all was vanity and a striving after wind, and there was nothing to be gained under the sun." Remember that Solomon had experimented with almost everything...materialism, beauty, wealth, women, work, and worldly wisdom. It is not just enough to stop sinning. We should replace our sin with doing the work of Christ. Eventually, Solomon found his sense of happiness. In Ecclesiastes 12:13, he says "The end of the matter; all has been heard. Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man."

While we can't live the same day repeatedly, we do have the opportunity to be transformed daily. We can repent of our sins and not repeat the same mistakes over and over. Living for Christ is not easy, but it gets easier the more we do it. Colossians 3:8-10 states, "But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator." As we create new habits built on our faith in God, our personality becomes more like Christ. Our bad habits become less and less likely.

Thank God we do get many second chances. God is a loving God, and we wake up to a new day every day. We can choose to re-live the same bad days, or we can choose to live for Christ. Are we making every day a better day and learning to affect others' lives in a positive way? The transformation of our lives can be made complete as our faith grows, and we strive to be more like Christ.
