



Thomas Watson writes in his book *The Art of Divine Contentment*, "For my part, I do not know of any ornament in religion that more bespangles a Christian, or glitters in the eye of God and man more, than this of contentment." Contentment is not something that comes to us naturally. Paul tells us in Philippians 4:11, "...for I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content." It is something that Paul had to learn. It did not come automatically the moment he became a Christian, and it is not something that just came with time. Contentment is a learned trait.

So, what is the biblical understanding of contentment? Easton's Bible Dictionary describes it as, "a state of mind in which one's desires are confined to his lot whatever it may be (1 Tim. 6:6; 2 Cor. 9:8). It is opposed to envy (James 3:16), avarice (Heb. 13:5), ambition (Prov. 13:10), anxiety (Matt. 6:25, 34), and repining (1 Cor. 10:10). It arises from the inward disposition, and is the offspring of humility, and of an intelligent consideration of the rectitude and benignity of divine providence (Ps. 96:1, 2; 145), the greatness of the divine promises (2 Pet. 1:4), and our own unworthiness (Gen. 32:10); as well as from the view the gospel opens up to us of rest and peace hereafter (Rom. 5:2)."

As we approach Thanksgiving this month, may we be reminded of the goodness of God towards us, and find in Him enough reason to be content. God has been good to all of us in different ways. Let's go through this season killing these fleshly desires of love for money, love for this world, desire for possessions and prestige, let us be content with what the Lord has given us. Then, let this contentment show itself forward in thankfulness to our God. He has saved us, He is sanctifying us, and He will come back for His people. Let us be content with what we have. As Paul told Timothy in 1 Tim. 6:8, "but if we have food and clothing, with these we will be content."

## Youth and Family Discipleship

As I have been preparing for preaching the past few weeks, I have mostly been struck by the idea that the Gospel is a very simple message. Twice in 1 Corinthians 1 and 2, Paul refers to "Christ crucified." That is the message. The cross is at the center of human history. It, along with the resurrection, is the most significant event to have ever occurred.

The cross is the only hope we have. It is the place where God's justice and love meet each other. The penalty that we deserved for our sin was laid upon Christ, and his perfect righteousness was given to us in return. I say "us" meaning those of us who have put our faith in Christ. It is at the cross that we are reconciled to a holy and loving God. Here are some lyrics of a beautiful song about the cross...

"The Power of the Cross"

Oh, to see the dawn
Of the darkest day:
Christ on the road to Calvary.
Tried by sinful men,

Nailed to a cross of wood.




